

Notes on the declaration of commitment:
(all documents must be submitted in the original and a copy)

Generally:

- German identity card, German passport or foreign passport
- Residence permit (valid for at least six months), unless you have a German one
Have nationality or are EU citizens.
- Rental agreement or in the case of home ownership: the last property tax assessment
or the notarial deed

Proof of financing/ensuring livelihood:

for employees:

- Employment contract (valid for at least 6 months)
- Current employer certificate as well as wage and salary slips
last 3 months (including your spouse)
- If applicable, assessment notice ALG I

for self-employed people:

- Business registration or extract from the commercial register; Shareholder agreement
- last income tax assessment
- Current BWA, alternatively an income surplus statement (EUR)
- Proof of the amount of the monthly health insurance contribution including
care insurance

for pensioners:

- Pension notice(s).

Miscellaneous:

- If applicable, blocked account including blocking note from the respective bank
- If necessary, documents about maintenance payments (children or divorced spouses)
- If necessary, a certificate from the maintenance advance fund of the responsible
youth welfare office or proof of monthly maintenance payments
- If applicable, document confirming the obligation to pay maintenance
- If applicable, a legally binding divorce decree

Fees:

- Fee €29.00 per declaration of commitment

Important information:

A declaration of commitment should be drawn up at the earliest 3 months before the planned entry.

Authorization by another person is **not** possible. _____

The immigration authorities reserve the right to request further evidence in individual cases.

Information on submitting a declaration of commitment in accordance with Section 68 of the Residence Act

If you would like to invite a citizen of a country for which a visa is required to visit Germany or for another purpose of stay, the diplomatic mission abroad will generally require a "declaration of commitment" from you as the inviting party.

The visa is issued by the German diplomatic mission in the country in which the foreigner is staying.

With this declaration, you undertake to cover all costs that arise during the visitor's stay in Germany.

In addition to the costs of living (food and drink, clothing, etc.) and accommodation (apartment or hotel), the obligation also includes any costs for medical care in the event of illness or need for care. To reduce the risk of unforeseen high medical costs such as: To exclude medical costs, medication or hospital costs, for example, health insurance must be taken out for the period of the visit.

The obligation also includes the costs of possible compulsory enforcement of the obligation to leave the country if the obligation to leave the country is not complied with voluntarily. With Submitting a declaration of commitment for a longer-term stay - e.g. B. to Family reunification – the takeover also includes the costs of an integration course.

If your guest receives social assistance or other public funds for any reason during their stay in Germany, this is due to the agreement you signed Declaration of commitment a claim for reimbursement from the carrier, ie the money paid out will be reclaimed by you as the obligated party.

The immigration authority to which you submit the declaration of commitment will therefore check whether you have enough income to be able to fulfill this obligation. You can ask the immigration authorities which documents you need to submit in detail or they will be communicated to you as part of the appointment confirmation.

Once issued, you will be given the original of the declaration of commitment, which you must send to your guest. Together with his application for a visa, your guest must submit the declaration of commitment and proof of health insurance along with a copy to the responsible German diplomatic mission.

The visa office of the foreign mission will decide on the application. In this context, it should be noted that submitting a declaration of commitment does not guarantee that a visa will be issued.

The so-called Schengen visa for visitors can be issued for a maximum of 90 days. At the same time, it should be noted that an extension of the visa is usually not possible.
